Clark County School Board Meeting

The Clark County School District will hold its regularly scheduled Board of Trustees meeting Thursday, May 30, at 7 p.m., at 2832 E. Flamingo Road. The following is one of the topics on the agenda for discussion and approval:

Administration is requesting authorization to develop and submit a grant proposal for a Compensatory Education project under the federal funding grant of Education Consolidated and Improvement Act of 1981, Chapter 1. This portion of

Chapter 1 funding was designed to provide resources for supplemental instructional programs for students who require special assistance to achieve at various levels appropriate to their learning capabilities. The Clark County School District proposal if funded will provide full-day reading and mathematics instruction to an estimated 840 kindergarten students, dual-enrollment reading or mathematics instruction to an anticipated 2,100 junior and senior high school students, and reading and mathematics skills instruction at the elementary and secondary level to an estimated 25 private school students and 210 instruction students. If the grant is approved the remedial

instruction will be provided during the 1985-86 school year.

Now that you are aware of the various remedial projects that the Clark County School District is developing and bringing to the community, all parents, as well as the whole community, should get more involved. This means attending school board meetings, joining the PTA and participating in auxiliary committees, etc. Visit your child's classroom and school, so you are kept abreast of what is being provided and offered to your child. With the additional knowledge, when becoming more involved, you as parents, and all of us in the community, are thus able to take advantage of the various programs offered.

Community Education Courses Planned for Summer in Henderson

Are you bored with the long, hot summer? Want to do something new and exciting?

Try a non-credit course at the Henderson Campus of Clark County Community College.

This is the first summer that the Henderson Campus will offer community education courses — a variety of interesting and informative classes for the people in the Henderson, Boulder City and East Las Vegas area.

The offerings vary from art to business to home repair.

Roy Purcell, well-known Western artist, will teach a class in etching and engraving starting June 3 at his gallery in Henderson. Purcell's studio-gallery at 3 Sunset Way is a popular tourist attraction. The longtime Southwestern artist terms his works as "historical mysticism." The Monday night class is limited to the first 15 persons who apply.

Enid Wetherill, a Henderson arts and crafts enthusiastic, will teach the ancient method of Ukranian egg decorating on Saturday morning starting June 8. The eggs, decorated with waxes and dyes, are a symbol of good luck.

Attorney Mark Jenkin will teach three courses, "The Law and Small Business," "Individual Taxation," and "A Review of Laws Affecting Families," all starting in early June.

The latter course will focus on topics of child custody, child support, community property and other family-related issues.

Sherry Motis will teach a course in setting up a small-business bookkeeping system. Students may attend the one-week course, starting June 10 or July 15.

Children, teenagers and adults are invited to enroll in classes that use the Suzuki method of learning to play string instruments.

Caroll Berns will teach "Beginning Suzuki Strings" for ages 3 and up starting June 3. A class entitled "Beginning String Orchestra" is open to all ages; it is aimed at persons just learning to read music for a bowed string instrument.

Musicians who can play a string instrument reasonably well may enroll in Berns' class, "Advanced String Orchestra," starting June 5.

Other classes offered this summer, with starting dates, include:

- Intermediate Guitar, June 3.
- Home Repair, June 5.
- Basic Auto Repair for men and women, June 3.
- Tapestry Weaving, June 4.
- Lace Draping in Porcelain, June 5 and July 11.
- Porcelain Dolls, June 5 and July 10.

Community education classes are open to anyone interested. Fees range from \$20 to \$75. Most of the classes cost about \$30. Senior citizens (62 and older) pay half price for most courses.

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
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
