

## Stevenson Promoted to Vice President

## Seastrand, Davis, Goynes win NLV seats

North Las Vegas Mayor James Seastrand buried his only challenger in a avalanche victory Tuesday, while Municipal Judge Gary Davis shattered the comeback attempt of former Judge Ray Daines.

In the race for two City Council seats, former Councilman Dale Huntsman and Councilman Theron Goynes defeated two opponents.

Meanwhile, voters endorsed a penny-per-gallon gas tax increase that the Legislature already had decided to impose regardless of the residents' vote.

Seastrand amassed 3,257 votes, or 82.3 percent, in the mayor's race, while Larry Grubb finished with 701 votes, or 17.7 percent.

In the court race, Davis collected 2,415 votes, or 55.7 percent, compared with 1,191 votes, or 44.3 percent, for Daines.

In the at-large race for two council seats, final returns showed Huntsman with 2,016 votes, or 28.5

percent followed by Goynes with 1,942 votes, or 27.5 percent. In third place was Vonne Chowning with 1,721 votes, or 24.3 percent, while Odell Davis finished in last place with 1,389 votes, or 19.7 percent.

On the gas tax question, 2,152 voters, or 53.7 percent, cast ballots in favor of the tax, while 1,854 voters, or 46.3 percent, opposed it.

North Las Vegas posted a 46.7 percent voter turnout, with 4,489 of the 9,614 registered voters casting ballots.

Seastrand, 55, campaigned vigorously for a second term even though his only challenger was a perennial candidate who has run unsuccessfully for office at least seven times.

## Assembly OKs health bills

SB136, a compromise between the hospital industry and the Bryan administration, establishes a commission to review health costs under the state Department of Human Resources.

## Drug raid nets arrest of six

An early morning raid of two Westside apartments by Metropolitan Police resulted in the arrests Sunday of six men and the seizure of an undisclosed amount of cocaine, officials said.

Police said officers netted cocaine in solidified "rock" form during the raid at 709 Madison Ave. and 713 Madison Ave. Officials did not reveal the value of the 18 "rocks" seized.

Those arrested in connection with the raid were identified by police as Elija Shelby, Charles Banks, Robert Cook, Sylvester Smith, Leon Cook and Willie Robert. The men were booked on charges of conspiracy to possess a controlled substance, police said.

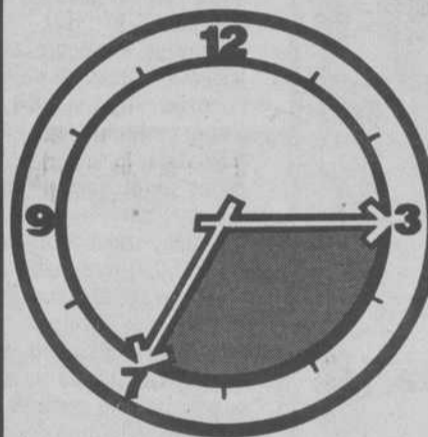
