Former Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm of New York will lead a new organization aimed at increasing the clout of black women in national politics.

The one-time presidential candidate, chosen Saturday as chairwoman of the National Political Congress for Black Women, vowed that 'never again'' will black women be disregarded.

She noted that Democratic presidential nominee Walter Mondale considered black men and whites of both sexes before selecting Geraldine Ferraro as his running mate



Black women realized then "we had no real political clout of our own," said Chisholm, who served in the U.S. Congress from 1968 to 1983 and ran for president in 1972
