

Governor Names White District Court Judge

LAS VEGAS — Governor Richard Bryan Monday announced the appointment of Clark County Justice of the Peace Earle W. White, Jr. to the Eighth Judicial District Court.

White, 51, has been a member of the Nevada Bar since 1964 and is admitted to practice in the United States District Court in Nevada and the United States Court of Appeals, District of Columbia.

White graduated with honors from Howard University School of Law in 1963, receiving the second highest grade point average in the history of that school, which was founded in 1869. He was editor of the Howard Law Journal his senior year.

White has been a member of the Nevada Bar since 1964, and is admitted to practice in the U.S. District Court in Nevada and the U.S. Court of Appeals in Washington, D.C.

A former Las Vegas Deputy Public Defender, White has served as Justice of the Peace, Las Vegas Township, Department 5, since 1980.

Judge White is active in numerous civic organizations, is a former

officer of the Clark County Legal Services Program and the Nevada Judges Association and serves on the faculty of the National Judicial College.

In a news conference at the state Bradley Building, Bryan, who worked with

White in the public defenders office in the 1970s, said:

"Earle White Jr. has an extensive background in all facets of the law. I am delighted to announce his appointment to the Eighth Judicial District Court, and he will do an outstanding job."

White, 51, who has been a justice of the peace since his appointment in 1980 to replace Al Becker, who was forced out of office, said the

enormity of the appointment was filling in and becoming more apparent.

Questioned about his reputation of favoring the prosecution, White said, "I don't guarantee a perfect hearing; I just try to be fair and give the accused the

benefit of every doubt."

White will be sworn in June 25, and take the bench the following day.

White's salary will jump from \$50,000 a year as justice of the peace to \$56,000, Court Administrator Anna Peterson said.

The new Clark County Judge, a 20-year resident of Nevada, is married and has two children.

Charge against George Osley Dismissed

A federal judge has dismissed an indictment charging former union boss George Osley with violation of federal tax laws.

The order of dismissal was signed by U.S. District Judge Howard McKibben.

Osley, the former secretary-treasurer of Laborers Local 872, was recently convicted by a federal jury on multiple charges of embezzlement, obstruction of justice, and making false entries in the union's books and annual financial report to the Department of Labor.

He was sentenced to three years in prison and was granted permission by the court to remain free as he appeals his conviction to the 9th Circuit Court.

The heart of the government's case was built on evidence that Osley transferred approximately \$14,000 in union funds to

pay for construction of his Las Vegas home and his 1981 election campaign.

Morris will take Kaufman's seat on housing panel

Leonard Morris, an accountant with the Wild West Electronics Co., was named by the County Commission to replace businessman Herb Kaufman on the Clark County Housing Authority. Kaufman had served on that board for 15 years.

County Commissioner William Pearson praised Kaufman for his service, but proposed the name of Morris to replace him. He said it was his feeling that new private citizens should be encouraged to participate in government, particularly when some of the county advisory boards have people who have served 15 to 20 years.

Eight Arrested in Drug Bust by SWAT

Eight people were arrested in raids by SWAT and patrol officers on two homes where rock cocaine allegedly was distributed, Metro Police said.

The arrests were made at 709 and 713 Madison St., following a police surveillance.

Arrested were John Young, 42; Monique Banks, 25; Walter Allen, 49; Lubbie Williams, 59; Lawanda Jackson, 22; Betty Ezell, 54; Alvin Gaston, 21, and a 15-year-old.

They were charged with

conspiracy to sell a controlled substance and possession of marijuana, cocaine and paraphernalia.

Several area residents told police those Madison Street apartments were "the place to get cocaine" in West Las Vegas.

Police recovered a half-ounce of rock cocaine, a small amount of powdered cocaine and marijuana valued at \$1,000.

Police said they investigated after residents complained about drug traffic in the area.
