## Las Vegas Students to Participate in Scholar Program at UNR School of Medicine

Some 15 high school students from Southern Nevada have been chosen to participate in the Minority High School Scholar Program July 8-12 at University of Nevada Reno School of Medicine.

The young scholars and their parents met Monday in Las Vegas with Joel Lanphear, Ph.D., Executive Associate Dean and Beverly Neyland, MD. Both are Coordinators of the program.

Dr. Lanphear explained that the program is designed to encourage students to consider medicine as a career and to acquaint them with the Nevada Medical School.

The students will join three others from Northern Nevada for a week of activities at the school's Reno campus.

They will meet with faculties and medical students and be told how to prepare for medical school. They will be given an orientation to campus life and participate in laboratory sessions designed to show them what medical education is like.

The 15 students are: Pamela Andrews, Beverly Givens and Victor Meeks of North Las Vegas; Leroy Davis and Pauline Macalino of Henderson; Stephen Beck, Robbilyn Fortson,

Trelynn Guice, Andrea Denice Henderson, Tfelainey Jones, Raimundo Leon, Lamarr Mitchell, Stephanie K. Newman, Laura E. Talavera and Renee Brown of Las Vegas.

The students were chosen because their High School principals, counselors or teachers identified them as outstanding. "They are the best and the brightest," explained Dr. Lanphear.

"The goal of the program is to start talented youngsters to thinking earlier in their high school studies about medicine as a career choice. The 2nd goal is to attract more qualified minority students into the Nevada University system and, ultimately, the School of Medicine."

## Robert Hill asks acquittal on conviction

Robert Hill, the former federal administrator convicted of accepting a gift from a Las Vegas anti-poverty agency, has asked a federal judge to set aside the jury's verdict and acquit him.

Hill, the 46-year-old former Western regional administrator of the Economic Development Administration, has been charged with accepting a \$1,000 bribe in exchange for recommending the approval of a \$91,000 grant to the Opportunities Industrialization Center.

However, a jury dismissed the two charges and found Hill guilty of accepting a gratuity, a less serious crime punishable by two years in prison.

Hill's attorney, Frank Creme, in a petition filed Monday in U.S. District Court, asked Judge Lloyd George to reverse the jury's verdict based on insufficient evidence.

Creme said the government had not provided evidence to show money given Hill by former OIC director James Chaney was anything but a loan between friends. He also said George had erred in instructing the jury that Hill could be found guilty of accepting a gratuity if not proven to have taken an outright bribe.

Creme has said he will appeal Hill's conviction to the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals if necessary.
