Adult Literacy Project Announced

WASHINGTON, D.C., June 24 -The Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) today announced its intent to commit funds to WQED-TV, Pittsburgh to begin work on a national outreach project on problems of adult illiteracy. Focusing on a PBS television special to be broadcast early in 1986, the effort will be designed to generate community involvement in participating PBS markets.

According to the U.S. Department of Education, 27 million adults in the United States are functionally illiterate and another 45 million are only marginally literate. The pool is growing by about 2.3 million persons each year. Illiteracy bears an
