The Clark County School District will hold its regularly scheduled board meeting on Thursday, July 11, at 7 p.m. at 2832 E. Flamingo Road. The following items are on the agenda for the board's approval:

The authorization to

submit a grant proposal for funding under the Johnson O'Malley Supplementary Service Project. Funding for the program is available for one year. The proposed intent of the project is to provide special activities for Indian students from the Las

Vegas area and the Moapa Indian Reservation. The scope of the program will include identification of Indian students and the development of an Individual Education Program for each eligible student. Services are available such as tutoring for junior high school students from the 7-9 grades in the area of reading and/or mathematics and counseling services for students in grades 11-12. There will also be community-based experiences for Indian students which will provide opportunities for the students to explore career aspirations and parental participation in student/parent counseling, cultural activities and training workshops. The estimated amount of funding for the program is \$65,830.90.

The board is also requesting approval to submit a proposal for grant funding to implement a Special Education Computer Training Project under the Education of the Handicapped Act. If approved, the funding will only be available for one year and will provide training and assistance to staff, implementation of individual education programs, the adaptation of appropriate computer software for use with handicapped students and maintenance of classroom records. workshops to staff demonstrating computer hardware and techniques for utilizing computer software in the classroom. Staff will also evaluate new and existing computer software, materials and programs in current use to determine their effectiveness in meeting educational needs of students with different handicapped conditions. The general scope of the proposal also deals with providing computer assistance to special education instructors, including the district's rural schools and the Nevada Department of Education in providing workshops. The grant request is for an estimated \$55,125.83.

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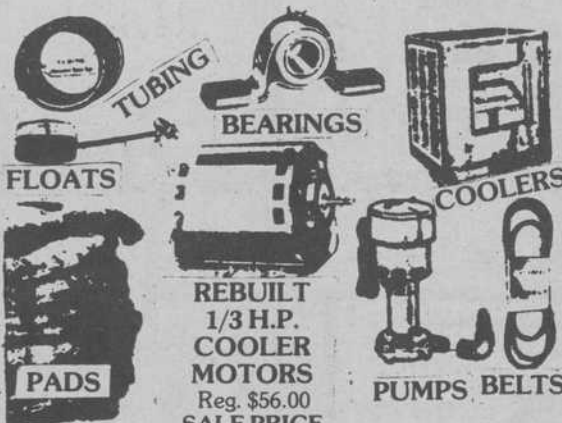
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
