The Clark County School District will hold its regularly scheduled board meeting on Thursday, July 11, at 7 p.m. at 2832 E. Flamingo Road. The following items are on the agenda for the board's

authorization to

submit a grant proposal for funding under the Johnson O'Malley Supplementary Service Project. Funding for

the program is available for one year. The proposed intent of the project is to provide special activities for Indian students from the Las

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Vegas area and the Moapa Indian Reservation. The scope of the program will include identification of Indian students and the development of an Individual Education Program for each eligible student. Services are available such as tutoring for junior high school students from the 7-9 grades in the area of reading and/or mathematics and counseling services for students in grades 11-12. There will also be community-based experiences for Indian students which will provide opportunities for the students to explore career aspirations and parental participation student/parent counseling, cultural activities and training workshops. estimated amount of funding program is \$65.830.90.

The board is also requesting approval to submit a proposal for grant funding to implement a Special Education Computer Training Project under the Education of the Handicapped Act. approved, the funding will only be available for one year and will provide training and assistance to staff, implementation of individual education programs, the adaptation of appropriate computer software for use with handicapped students maintenance and of classroom records. computer consultant will provide regularly scheduled

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
