Committee To Study Funding For Higher Education Named

CARSON CITY — Governor Richard Bryan Thursday announced the appointment of five members to the Committee to Study Funding for Higher Education, an interim committee created by the last session of the Nevada Legislature.

The committee will compare current ways of funding higher education in Nevada with other states. It will decide which methods work best.

Elaine Wynn of Las Vegas will represent the governor. Wynn serves as chairman of the UNLV Foundation and received "The Woman of the Year" award last year.

Three educators were named by Bryan. They are: Dr. Robert Maxson, President of UNLV, Dr. Paul Meacham, President of Clark County Community College and Dr. Joseph Crowley,

President of the University of Nevada Reno.

Bill Bible, Director of the Department of Administration was also appointed to the committee by the governor.

Nine other members will also serve, three each from the Senate, Assembly, and Board of Regents. They are chosen by members of their respective groups.

The Board of Regents has appointed Carolyn Sparks of Las Vegas, Daniel Klaich of Reno and JoAnn Sheerin of Carson City.

The Assembly appointed Bill Bilyeu of Elko, Bob Thomas of Carson City and Joe Dini of Yerington.

Representing the Senate are James Gibson of Henderson, Bill Raggio of Reno and Don Mello of Sparks.

Rancho Fall Registration Scheduled

All pre-registered students zoned for Rancho High School should report for fall registration on Thursday, August 29, 1985. Registration will take place in the cafeteria according to the following schedule:

7:30 a.m. — Pre-registered Seniors A-K
8:15 a.m. — Pre-registered Seniors L-Z
9:15 a.m. — Pre-registered Juniors A-K
10 A.M. — Pre-registered Juniors L-Z
11 a.m. — Pre-registered Sophomores A-K
11:45 a.m. — Pre-registered Sophomores L-Z
12:30 p.m. — Pre-registered Freshmen A-K
1:15 p.m. — Pre-registered Freshmen L-Z

Students who do not report for registration at the designated times may face a delay enrolling in school and may not be able to enroll in first choice courses.

Late registration is scheduled for September 3, 1985 from noon to 2 p.m. in the cafeteria.

Students who have not pre-registered, including students zoned for Rancho, who did not pre-register in junior high during the spring, as well as new students to the Clark County School District, should plan on pre-registering between August 20-23, 1985. These students should report to the assistant principal over zoning to verify address and clear for registration. Actual enrollment will be conditioned upon proof of residency within the zone. For that reason, students should be prepared to show proof, such as a power bill, rent receipt or some other document, which would verify residency.
