# Bishop Tutu Called "World Freedom Fighter"

- In a last-minute strategy session with his national staff, a pioneer Black disc jockey Jack Gibson - who now publishes America's oldest and largest-circulated Black trade publication "Jack the Rapper" reiterated his decision to bar South African music industry representatives from his annual summer music convention and called Bishop Desmond Tutu a "world freedom fighter."

Responding to a letter from a South African travel agency in which the feisty publisher was asked to reconsider a request that South Africans be allowed to attend "Family Affair '85," which convened at the Marriott Marquis Hotel from August 15-18, Gibson vowed to break communicataions with the racist government until "human rights for South African Blacks is assured.

"The courage being displayed daily by Bishop Desmond Tutu is an echo of the bravery that propelled the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. into the forefront of world consciousness,' said Gibson, "and we consider Bishop Tutu to be a world freedom fighter with no living

The annual Black music and radio convention is in its ninth year and registration was at an all-time high. In addition to the usual seminars and workshops on

ATLANTA, Georgia (KNS) subjects of interest to the more than 2,000 radio and music executives who attended the convention, Gibson unveiled a project that calls on the nation's entertainers to become more involved in problems of poverty and hunger in America.

"We are going to dare to be different this year," said Gibson, who orchestrated a 200-station "Stevie Wonder Birthday Radio Network'' earlier this year when the South African Broadcasting Corporation banned Wonder's music after the superstar dedicated a music award to Nelson Mandela, the jailed leader of the outlawed African National Congress.

Dell and the Sensations, a Belizean-American music group in Southern. California, dedicated their album "Freedom Fighter," toBishop Tutu, who won the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize. Copies of the title song were distributed to disc jockeys at the convention.

Black newspapers thrughout the U.S. assisted Gibson in his call for information.
