

Minority Enterprise Week Oct 6-12

President Ronald Reagan has declared October 6 through 12 as Minority Enterprise Development Week. He proclaims that "minority enterprises today from a significant proportion of all the Nation's businesses, and their number is continuing to grow," and calls upon "all American to join together with minority business enterprises across the country in appropriate observance."

In conjunction with this observance, the Nevada Economic Development Company (NEDCO) is holding their annual Awards Luncheon on Friday, Oct. 11 at the Hotel Moulin Rouge at 900 W. Bonanza. This luncheon will be the culmination of Minority Enterprise Development Week at which time NEDCO, along with district Small Business Administration and Reynolds Electrical and Engineering Company (REECO) will present awards to outstanding minority small business in Las Vegas.

Liquor-Gaming Board Adopts New Ordinance

Bruce Woodbury, Chairman of the Clark County Liquor and Gaming Licensing Board, announced today that a new ordinance has been adopted by the Board this date which

makes it unlawful for a Clark County liquor licensee to pay any "tip" or "kickback" to taxi drivers for delivery or customers to their establishment.

This new law becomes

effective October 14, 1985. Violators will be subject to misdemeanor penalties and could face possible revocation of their liquor license through disciplinary proceedings.

Executive Vice President Van Heffner of the Nevada Restaurant Association was present at the meeting and advises his office will notify their membership which includes over 250 members.
