### UNLV Takes University of Pacific at Silver Bowl

UNLV Coach Harvey Hyde and his staff must be doing something right. The Rebels hosted the University of Pacific last Saturday night at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl. The Pacific team with a 2-0 conference record (3-2 overall) was stopped by a score of 24-14. UNLV was dominant from the beginning (and good thing), because of what appeared to be a lack of concentration for quarterback Steve Stallworth who threw a ball that was intercepted and returned for a touchdown.

The man of the hour was junior runningback Kirk Jones. Jones dominance was in time of possession with 21 rushes for 120 yards.

The UNLV Rebel scored the first touchdown with a little less than six minutes expiring from the game clock. UNLV scored against just eight minutes later as

Quarterback Stallworth completed his first 10 passes before his first incompleteness.

The second half of the ball game, UNLV picked up where they had left off at halftime. It took the second half kickoff and drove 76 yards in nine plays to make it 24-0 with 10:36 to play in the third quarter. The defeat knocked the Tigers to 3-3, 2-1 out of first place. The UNLV now stands at 3-3 overall and 2-2 in the PCAA.

### Runnin' Rebels set for Nov. 22 open

UNLV men's basketball season kicks off Nov. 22 against visitors Nevada-Reno. The UNLV women's basketball, ranked 16th, will return all five starters from last year's 26-5 club. They won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship and advanced to the first round of the NCAA tournament for the second straight time. The season kicks off Nov. 22-23 in

Tempe during the Arizona State tournament.

### Greg Sims faces burglary sentencing

UNLV senior defensive tackle Greg Sims, will be sentenced on Nov. 4 by District Judge Myron Leavitt after pleading guilty to a burglary charge. Sims was charged with stealing personal property from an elderly woman tourist after entering her room at the Landmark Hotel.

A robbery conviction carries a possible prison sentence of one to 15 years.

### Triple 'Main Events' Head Pro Wrestling Card at Showboat

Three big bouts, including a "Sicilian Stretcher Match" and an American heavyweight championship battle, top the monthly professional wrestling card on Saturday, Oct. 19, at the Showboat Hotel, Casino, Country Club and Bowling Center.

The stretcher match, in which the loser must be carried from the ring on a stretcher, is an "anything goes," referee-out-of-the-ring affair pitting 276-pound Steve "The California Terminator" Strong of Venice Beach against 256-pound Victor Rivera of Puerto Rico. It's a one-fall, no-time-

limit match.

The championship match, also one fall with no time limit and no disqualification, features 242-pound Chief Jay Strongbow, Jr. of Oklahoma against 236-pound "Ripper Savage" of The Bronx.

The third "main" is a tag-team match, best two-out-of-three falls with a 45 minute time limit, between 245-pound "Wild Man" Jack Armstrong of New York with 251-pound "The Great Goliath" of New Mexico and Dos Medicos de Mexico (The Two Medics from Mexico) with a combined weight of 496 pounds.

The action starts at 7:30 p.m. with doors to the Showboat Sports Pavilion opening at 6.

Tickets are priced at \$12 for ringside reserved, \$9 for general admission and \$6 for general admission for those 14 years of age and under and are on sale from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday at the Showboat Sports Pavilion Ticket Office.

Two other one-fall, 30 minute time limit heavyweight matches are scheduled: 226-pound Tony Rocco of Italy against 246-pound Saladore Lothario of Texas and 310-pound "Professor" Toru Tanaka.

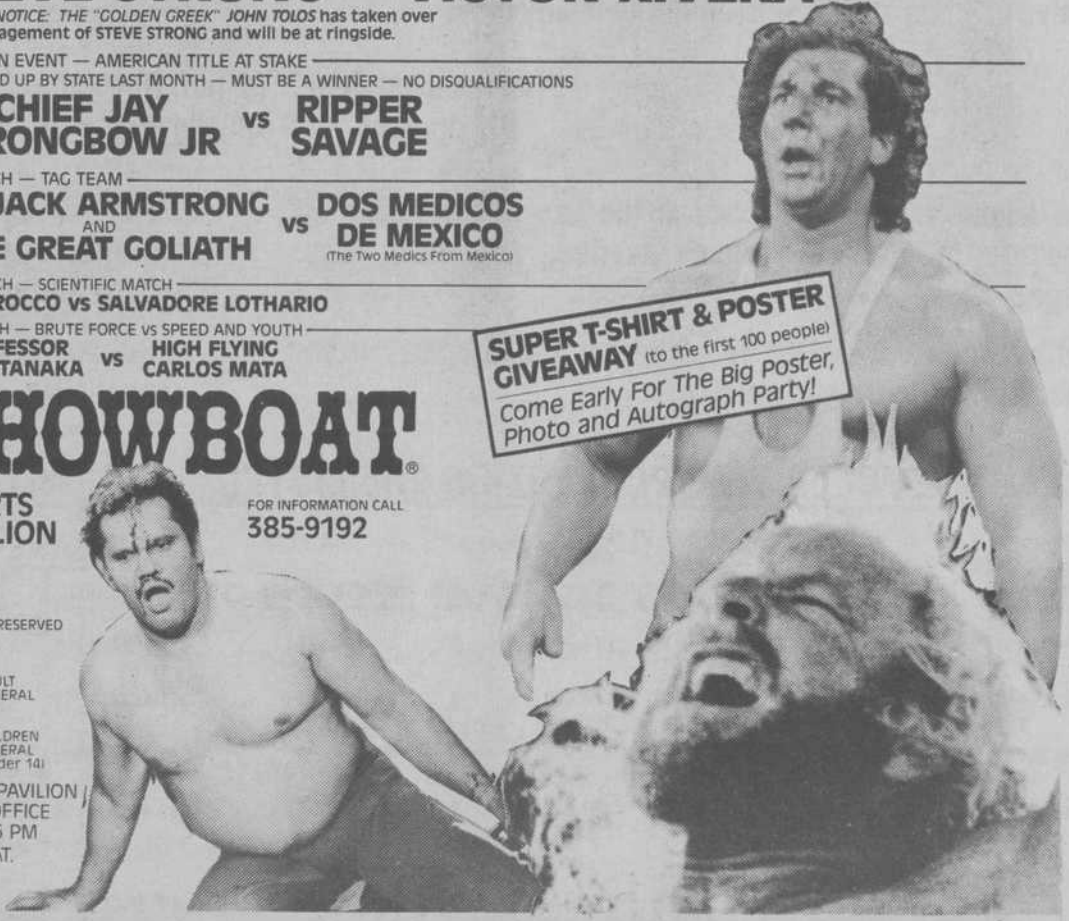
