RENO — The Hug Hawks found their thrill with Harlin Hill

The Hug quarterback accounted for 285 of his team's 457 yards and ran for one touchdown to lead the Hawks past McQueen, 29-17, Saturday at Hug in a Northern AAA game.

Hill, a senior, completed 16 of 24 passes for 227 yards and rushed nine times for 58 yards to guide the Hawks to their second victory this season.

"I'm really proud of our kids," Hug first-year coach Rick Borba said. "The kids really executed well.

Hug's John Campbell rushed 13 times for 89 yards and sophomore Chris Carr carried 14 times for 71 yards, including a game-breaking 7-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

Hug improved to 2-5 overall and in league. McQueen, picked to finish fourth and make the playoffs by league coaches in a preseason poll, fell to 2-6 overall and 2-5 in league. McQueen quarterback Dave McKnight completed 20

of 25 passes for 217 yards and one touchdown.
