Rev. "The church has always been the focal point of the unity of Black people. Let therefore return to those days and regroup for the survival of this community,

Rev. Parks is assisted totally in his ministry by his wife, Essie, who is a popular woman and local beautician. They depend upon each

Rev. Parks organized the Community Baptist Church for the Black people in Henderson so they would be able to assemble together. It was from that beginning that Rev. Sam Roberson has continued and his congregation has now built a facility where they can worship and have their own local meeting place.

Rev. Parks is an innovative pastor who reaches out to all, but especially to the young and the elderly. He encourages progress through education, doing for oneself and self determination. He wants things to happen but let's all of us know that you must

BLACK MINISTER EXPOSES PSYCHIATRIC PLAN AGAINST RELIGION

The Rev. Dr. Joseph Paige, Executive Vice President of Shaw Divinity School, the oldest black divinity school in America, is emerging as one of the key leaders in the fight for religious freedom in this country and throughout the world.

The New Life Tabernacle Church is in revival during this week. Elder William Jones is pastor. Just days ago, Dr. Paige, recent founder of the World Council on Religious Freedom, an organization dedicated to protecting religious liberty throughout the world, made a startling submission to the United Nations' Commission on Human Rights.

At a meeting with the

Deputy Director of the Commission, held in Geneva, Switzerland, Dr. Paige and a representative of the Los Angeles based Religious Freedom Crusade, delivered a report which revealed a coordinated psychiastric attack against religion in five countries around the world, including the U.S. The trip was founded by a grant from the International Association of Scientologists.

In an exclusive interview, Dr. Paige charged, "There is a disturbing pattern to these attacks. In all of these, in each of the countries involved, the same American psychiatrists are quoted in an attempt to give credibility to what are clearly gross attempts to institute psychiatric controls over religious beliefs, and to invalidate spiritual revelation, and religious practice. These attacks must be stopped!"

The report, which was prepared by the Religious Freedom Crusade, pinpoints American psychiatrists Dr. John Clark, Dr. Jolly West, psychologist and Margaret Singer, as world leaders in the anti-religious movement. All three have consistently used their positions in attempts to invalidate certain religious beliefs and practices. All three have checkered backgrounds.

Dr. Clark has been reprimanded on at least one occassion for improperly diagnosing a person as mentally ill simply because of the person's religion,
