MINISTERS ALLIANCE REVEALS PLANS FOR EXPANSION OF BUSINESSES, JOBS

The Ministerial Alliance is working on a program to bring 300 businesses and 900 jobs to the black community in the next three to five years to help off-set 50 the percent unemployment among the

community's youths and 15 percent among the area's adult male population.

In 1983 the Alliance made Otis Harris, former executive director of the Southern Economic Nevada Development Council (SNEDCO), its economic

development advisor, and through its urging Harris charted the private, nonprofit New Dawn Technical Institute to work in adjunct with the profit-making New Dawn Investment and Development Corp.

Both were created to bring jobs and economic development to the black With the community. institute individuals can donate or invest and get tax refunds on their dollars, and the corporation allows community members to collectively invest their dollars and to own a major project, Harris said.

To bring about its plans, the Alliance has been working in conjunction with the state, Clark County and the city of Las Vegas to build an incumbator building somewhere in the community.

Harris said the incubator facility could bring 300 businesses and 900 jobs to the community in the next three to five years.

Harris said an incubator building is where a number of businesses work together under the same roof with affordable rents sharing

services and equipment and with equal access to professional and financial programs.

Harris said the facility "is just like a university with one manufacturing brain and the other businesses. It's a factory for businesses."

Harris said the next step in making the facility a reality is the development of a planning study to determine who will own the building, the types of businesses that should go into it, its location and its size.

Harris said the facility is the cornerstone of New Dawn and the base for the Alliance's development plan




costs while the new skills the trainees acquired will enable them to work and earn far into the future.
