- 2) Electronic Technology (24 weeks)
- 3) Retail Cashiering (8 weeks)

Training in tuition free for eligible participants.

Classes are in session from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Training also includes individual instruction, job application and resume preparation techniques, job search procedures, video mock-job-interviews, and job placement assistance.
