

Dwayne Banks death said to remain a mystery

The Clark County District Attorney's Office has found nothing unusual about the death of Dwayne Banks, who died mysteriously Oct. 20 in the North Las Vegas Jail, but witnesses indicate the young man died of neglect or at the hands of arresting officers.

Bank's body was discovered at 8:05 p.m. Oct. 20 in his cell, and an autopsy discovered later that the 26-year-old died from the ingestion of 1,037 monograms of cocaine, more than twice the amount required to kill a person.

After a review of the incident, Deputy District Attorney Bill Koot has determined that nothing was unusual about the death of

the known drug dealer.

However, authorities have refused to reveal the identity of the arresting officers and the coroner has declined to comment to the press on the case. Written information about the case has been sealed from scrutiny of the press by authorities.

However, reconstruction of the arrest and subsequent death of Banks by witnesses and authorities indicate the death was far from routine.

Banks allegedly ran into the street of the 600 Block of East Carey Avenue, and flagged down the officers who later arrested him.

The officers said they had to subdue Banks when he refused to submit to arrest for irrational behavior.

The unidentified officers said they suspected Banks was under the influence of drugs.

Unofficial reports show Banks had swallowed about six rock cocaine crystals at about 8 a.m. that day outside the Sugar Hill Bar, located at 1316 Miller Ave., to prevent detection by police of drug
