# 5th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Birthday Parade Set

"LIVING THE DREAM" is the theme of the 5th Annual Birthday Celebration held here in Las Vegas to highlight the 57th birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The parade will be held on Saturday January 18, 1986 in downtown Las Vegas Nevada. The parade will start at 11:00 a.m. originating at Las Vegas High School.

As in the four previous years, the parade will be led by the Nellis Air Force Base

Tailpipe inspections in Clark and Washoe Counties will be more stringent in 1986.

Michael Naylor, Clark County Health District air pollution control director, says that cars receiving regular maintenance will likely pass the new test. Those not properly maintained, or cars misfueld with leaded gasoline may not.

"We calculate that less than seven percent of the vehicles in Clark County fail the current tailpipe Honor and Color Guards, followed by a host of floats, bands, marching units, fraternal and social organizations. The local grand marshalls


