After you have kept your resolution to your God, your families and church, the NAACP comes next in terms of giving money as well as your participation.

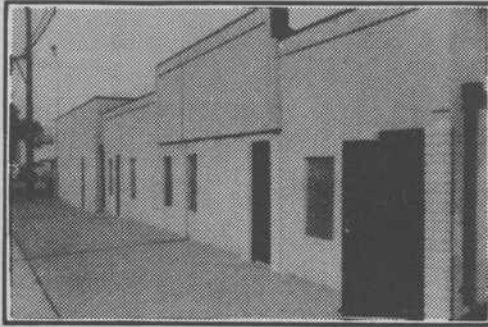
Your love for an individual, your family, your God as well as the NAACP, is measured not in what you say or promise but in terms of the amount of time, effort,

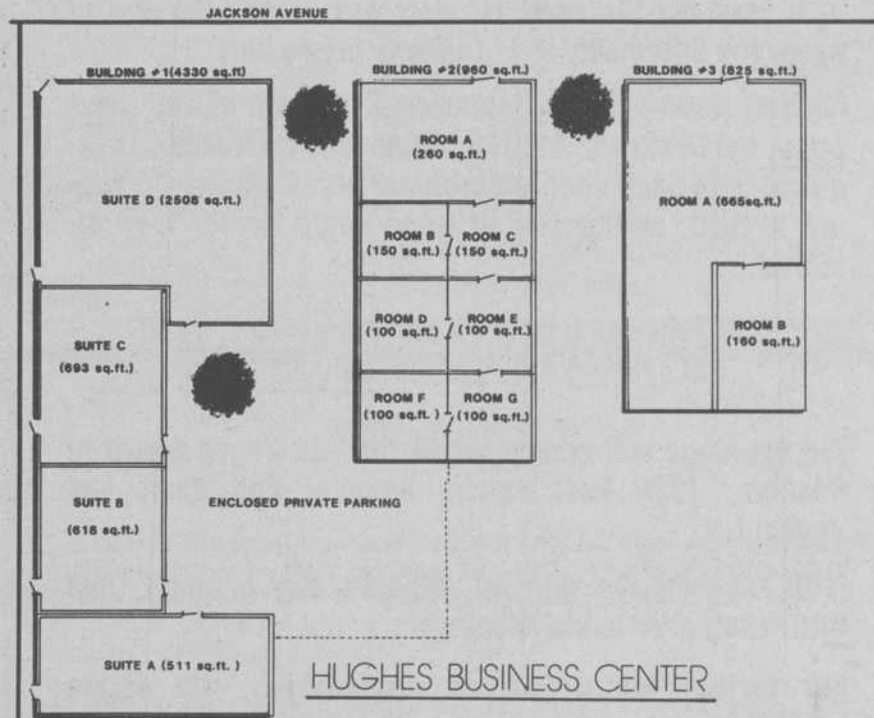
