NLV studying flood hazard areas

North Las Vegas is continuing its aggressive efforts to promote industrial and residential development.

One of the city's most recent actions is a \$6,000 study being undertaken by Montgomery Engineers of Nevada to accurately delineate special flood hazard zones on a portion of the western tributary of the Las Vegas Wash. Public works director, Gary W. Holler, said, "Information gained from the study will be used to design a flood control

project that will minimize special flood hazards in order to promote development. We'll be able to appeal National Flood Insurance Program mapping to reduce federal restrictions to development." The study will be completed in January,

The study area generally encompasses a portion of the Las Vegas Wash between the Craig Ranch Golf Course northwest of Craig Road and North 5th Street to the City's
