Registration

Students should register with the instructor in the classroom during the first class unless pre-registration is indicated. All fees are payable at the time of registration. Fees should be paid by check or money order.

Fees

There are no fees for students who do not have a high school diploma and are not presently enrolled in a regular school. All others will be charged \$42.00 for each one-half credit.

Counseling and Testing

STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA FOR ADULTS

Students shall fulfill the following minimum requirements for high school graduation. Students cannot graduate under the adult high school diploma requirements until they have reached 18 years of age or their high school class has graduated.

Proficiency Examination

Adults, who started the ninth grade in the fall semester of 1978, shall successfully complete the Nevada Proficiency Examination in mathematics, reading and writing to qualify for a standard high school graduation diploma.

Required Areas of Study

Students shall successfully complete with a passing grade 8 1/2 units of credit in the required areas of study.

- a. American Government 1
- b. American History 1
- c. English 3
- d. Health Education 1/2
- e. Mathematics 2
- f. Science 1
- TOTAL 8 1/2

Elective Areas of Study/GED

Students shall successfully complete with a passing grade 9 1/2 units of credit in elective areas of study. Credit can be transferred in from other educational programs; university credit; credit from military programs; summer school credit; correspondence course credit for apprenticeship programs, career schools, and work experience; from test scores on the General Educational Development test.
