### Bishop Tutu Praised NABWG

Nobel Peace Prize Winner, Desmond M.K. Tutu, Anglican Bishop of Johannesburg, South Africa, praised the National Association of Blacks Within Government (NABWG) in his final public address at the organization's 1986 Humanitarian Awards Banquet held recently in the Nation's Capital.

"I commend this organization for its initiative to keep Blacks aware of their history," said the Bishop.

The Black Medallion Humanitarian Award represents the contributions of the four Black Nobel Peace Prize winners: Dr. Ralph J. Bunche, 1950; Albert Jon

Luthuli, 1960; Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., 1964; and Bishop Desmond M.K. Tutu, 1984. The Medallion is sculptured in their likeness and represents unity, harmony, peace, and service to mankind.

Bishop Tutu concluded his address, constantly punctuated by thunderous applause, saying, "Freedom is indivisible and until those in South Africa are free you are unfree."

Lonis Ballard, President, NABWG, pointed out that NABWG continues its firm support for Bishop Tutu and the Black peoples of South Africa for their relentless fight and inspired mission to

overcome the horrors of apartheid non-violently.

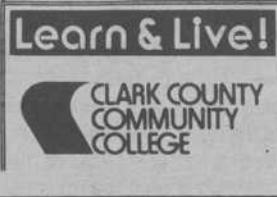
