Budget earmarks military funds

WASHINGTON President Reagan's proposed fiscal 1987 budget includes \$68.5 million for military construction programs in Nevada, according to U.S. Sen. Paul Laxalt, R.-Nev.

The funds include \$35.2 million proposed for electronic warfare range improvements, work on a runway and land acquisition at the Fallon Naval Air Station.

Another \$25.5 million is earmarked for Nellis Air Force Base, for work on a civil engineering complex, combat support center, dining hall and airfield improvements.

Another \$7 million would go to the Hawthorne Army Ammunition Plant, for an ammunition "surveillance" facility

And \$1.7 million would go to the Indian Springs Air Facility . Force
