

After receiving his B.S. Degree in Kinesiology Physical Education Bayless, stayed on in 1973-1974 as assistant track coach, while completing his Masters Degree in Educational Psychology.

Joining Warner, the top recruits are Oklahoma Stale player Greg Miller. Miller, a strong serve and volley player, shows an impressive record as Oklahoma State finished 17th in the nation. Mark Coronda, a freshman from Carlsbad, California, is ranked in the top 50 in the nation in 18's.



Adam Berr, freshman from Hollywood, Florida, is ranked 85th in the nation in 18's. Lee Rosenthal another. freshman from Hollywood, Florida is also ranked in the top 85 in the nation. John McCarley is a junior transfer from Midland Jr. College in Texas. Completing the squad is senior Tom Sullivan from Colorado. Sullivan played number two and three last year with Zohar Bewray from Israel playing fourth and fifth. Jim Craig from San Diego, California played sixth and seventh and number three doubles.

In addition to the men's squad, the UNLV women's team kicked off its first season in January with several locals. Cindy Lauer, a graduate of Clark High School, played last year for the University of Houston in Texas. Joining Lauer are locals Marie Sleeper and Kimberly Latham. Jane Howe from New Zealand completes the lineup. Howe is a transfer student from Midland Jr. College. Coach Witcher is working on other recruits to complete the squad. Daily practice is from noon to 5 p.m.
