The Westside Community Development Board of Trustees is asking all West Las Vegas property owners to help us celebrate April 1986 as "Keep West Las Vegas Beautiful."

During the past decade or more, millions of dollars have been appropriated to clean up, fix up, and spruce up West Las Vegas, at no cost to the property owners, to make our area more attractive and viable.

Between July, 1977 and July, 1985, this writer has written scores of articles which have appeared in the Las Vegas Sentinel-Voice Newspaper, encouraging property owners in our area to spruce up, fix up, paint up, and clean up our properties. And for six straight years the Mayor of the City of Las Vegas, in cooperation with the Westside Community Commission has declared the month of May as "Clean Up Month in West Las Vegas."

Not only does cleaning up and painting up our properties make them more attractive, sanitary and healthful, but it also increases the value of our real estate, which is our single most important

investment.

Our community, West Las Vegas, is one of the most visible to the thousands of motorists who travel I-15 daily. Our area, once cleaned up thoroughly, will attract more tourists and businesses to the area, resulting in an increase in employment.
