

NEW YORK-Actor-singer Harry Belafonte Saturday discussed a possible run for the U.S. Senate in 1986 with the head of the state Democratic Party, a party spokesman said.

Belafonte's discussion with state Democratic Party chief Larry Kirwan about a challenge to incumbent Republican Alfonse D'Amato "was a very serious conversation -- Mr. Belafonte is seriously interested in a race," said party spokesman William Cunningham.


