Belafonte ponders U.S. Senate Bid in '86

NEW YORK—Actor-singer Harry Belafonte Saturday discussed a possible run for the U.S. Senate in 1986 with the head of the state Democratic Party, a party spokesman said.

Belafonte's discussion with state Democratic Party chief Larry Kirwan about a challenge to incumbent Republican Alfonse D'Amato "was a very serious conversation -- Mr. Belafonte is seriously interested in a race," said party spokesman William Cunningham.

The 59-year-old entertainer and political activist and Kirwan were expected to discuss the possibility of Belafonte's candidacy again soon, Cunningham said.

Art-A-Fair Winners Announced

Some of Southern Nevada's most promising artists packed the Flamingo Library's Main Gallery Feb. 16, as the 12th annual Las Vegas-County Library District's Art-A-Fair opened with an award ceremony in the afternoon followed by a reception in the evening.

Out of a field of 485 art works, submitted by more than 200 artists, 73 pieces were selected for the exhibit, which has grown to be one of the area's most prestigious juried art competitions.

First place and \$400 donated by Shearson/Lehman Bros. Inc., and American Express Company were awarded by Alan Platzer for his photo, "Car Parked in Yard, 15th St. and Franklin Ave."

Second place and \$300 contributed by an anonymous donor went to Joel Holmes for his ceramic "No Star Wars Technology."

Third place honors and \$200 donated by Desert Decor were given to Pasha Rafat for his photo/silkscreen "Cheyenne Autumn."

Each place winner also received a \$100 gift certificate from Aaron Brothers and Dick Blick West.

First honorable mention and \$50 donated by Copy Cat Printing went to Keith Grove for the photograph "Jensen, Garcia, Ming."

Purchase awards, which become part of the library's permanent art collection, were awarded to Keith Grove for "Jensen, Garcia, Ming . . ." and to Kim Kennedy for the tapestry "Woven Double."

In making her decision, sole juror Suzanne Muchnic, art critic for the Los Angeles Times, said she looked at six criteria. Foremost on her list was "the confluence of form and content and emotional resonance." She also evaluated the art based on
