The convening officers of this Regional Training Conference were Virna Canson, regional director, James Colquitt, regional chairman and Frank L. Berry, president of the host branch.

The following meetings, workshops and seminars were held during the conference; branch administration, community training meeting, survival strategies, branch and youth presidents, lawyers meeting, youth work committee, ministers luncheon,

including the Black family, ACT/SO, economic development and youth work.

The NAACP and the Black Family

The Black family is a unit of Society within a Society. Some sociologists have referred to this unit as a subculture, that is a culture within a culture. Needless to say, the American culture as a whole is very important, but equally as important to the Black family is the Black culture.

The following is a partial list of the Black family subculture: shelter, food, music, dance, speech, education, dress and lifestyles generally.

This writer believes that the Black family will not be able to rightfully assume its position on the American scene until it lay claim to its

Black identity.

Anthropologically speaking, the Black man came from Africa, therefore he should be referred to as Afro-American or Black man. Just as the American Society is not what it used to be, the Black family isn't what it used to be either.

There are many intervening factors that have brought about these changes. Such as automation, inflation, unemployment, cost of living and a lack of communal and support systems.

Historically, the Black family unit played the role of protecting, serving and developing its own. The Black family must realize as a unit, that it is very important that every member of that unit must love and respect itself as well as one another.
