personal property he has bought.

Sources say only about 25 pastors live that well while the rest of the ministers struggle to make ends meet by holding fish fries, bar-bcues and rummage sales.

To contrast the struggling and those who are well taken care of, Rev. Davis is paid between \$700 and \$800 a week in addition to the congregation paying all his bills, hospitalization, life insurance premiums and for travel

However, with the money, the prestige and the other perks come pitfalls.

One elderly sister in one of the Pentecostal churches, whose husband was a minister before he died several years ago, said one of those pitfalls is that "95 percent of the pastors are saved from the belt up."

Preachers are tempted daily by the women who attend their churches, and some are reported as giving in to the temptation.

The women said many a Sunday she watched her

She said pastors, when it comes to women, are "very weak" like most men, and all the wives of those pastors can do while they are philandering is to "pray for them and their mistresses."


There are many stories in the black community about pastors who have given in to temptation.
