Pendleton Returns to Sahara Following Mayweather Upset

Freddie Pendleton shocked everyone when he stopped former world champion Roger Mayweather in six rounds last month in the Sahara's last ESPN/Top Rank boxing event. Pendleton will face Shelton "Too Sweet" LeBlanc in the main event on Friday, April 11 headlining a card which promises boxing fans an exciting evening.

Pendleton, having a reputation for staying on his feet throughout, and LeBlanc will go 10 rounds in the lightweight contest.

Also on the card is heavyweight Avery Rawls taking on Mike Hunter in an 8-round bout. Lightweight bouts featuring Felix Gonzales vs. Vernon "Yogi" Bunchanan and Zack Padilla vs. Dwayne Prim will be eight round events with two other 6-rounders filling out the 6-event card.

The card starts at 6:00 p.m. with the doors opening at 5:00 p.m. in the Sahara Space Center.

Tickets are on sale 24 hours a day at the casino cage and cost \$10.00 for general admission and \$15.00 for reserved ringside seating.

Pendleton, coming off the biggest win of his career, calls himself 'the best 14-12-1 fighter in the world' and has acquired the respect he

feels he needs to compete at the highest level. At 14-12-1, Freddie's most recent victories were over Mayweather (KO), Roberto Mandez (KO) and Darryl Martin (KO). Pendelton was winning on points before

falling in a non-title bout with IBF Champion Jimmy Paul in Atlantic City last November.

LeBlanc, a southpaw and excellent counter puncher, was a 5-time Louisiana Golden Gloves Champion and finished his amateur career at 260-32. The 4-time ABF Champ was a 1980 Olympic Trials Semi-Finalist. Shelton KO'd Ronald Haynes in the first round in Houston, Texas last December in his most recent competition. LeBlanc and Pendleton are both 23

Avery Rawls lists a pro record of 8-0 with KO's. Most recently he bested Nathaniel Robinson in Las Vegas in January and put him down in the second

Rawls' opponent is Mike Hunter. Heavyweight Hunter is just beginning his professional career and has won all three of his pro bouts.

Vernon "Yogi" Buchanan will face Felix Gonzales in an 8-round event. Buchanan has two wins in early 1986, stopping Alex Byrd in Mt. Clemens, Michigan (KO 1) on Feb. 16 followed by a KO 5 of Nick "K.O." Parker in Atlantic City on Mar. 22.

Buchanan, a natural junior lightweight, will enter the 1986 ESPN Tournament as a lightweight. Gonzales boasts four KO's in early rounds in his most recent action over James Sowell (KO 1) in May of 1985, Marcel Wade (KO 2) in March of 1985, Tim Brooks (KO 3) in January of 1985, and Rene Hedman (KO 2) in December of 1984.

In a fourth eight-round match-up Zack Padilla will take on Dwayne Prim in a lightweight battle. Padilla is 6-0-1 with 6 KO's and his only draw coming July of 1985 versus Ernie Landeros in Las Vegas. Padilla has KO'd each of his opponents by the fourth round with the draw coming in a four-round contest.

Prim is a good puncher who comes straight ahead and applies plenty of pressure. Dwayne was 1-1 in the latter part of 1985 with a KO 1 over Roosevelt Rico in Ft. Worth, Tex. in July and losing to Shelton LeBlanc in Lafayette, La. in September in a 12-rounder. Both 8-round lightweight contests (Buchanan vs. Gonzales and Padilla vs. Prim) are ESPN Tournament western semifinal contests.
