THE COALITION TO PRESERVE THE IMAGE OF THE CHURCH

As a continuing series of articles are received at the Las Vegas Sentinel-Voice relating to our just completed three-part series on "Our Churches-Yesterday and Today," we have selected this week a report from the Inglewood, California Rainbow Magazine (a monthly publication) which shows how the ministers of that area are working toward preserving the sacred image of the Christian Church." They have formed an organization now known The Coalition To Preserve The Image Of The Church. This is their report:

Local ministers known as The Coalition to Preserve the Sacred Image of the Christian Church have taken an active part in cleaning-up issues regarding Black Baptist ministers and the news media. One of the coalition's objective was to decide what avenue to take. Instead of being defensive, they intend to use offensive measures, and to project a positive image among the media. The coalition developed a set of by-laws to follow and a 10-point platform. The ministers all agreed they have to rebuild church and school, but whatever they do, they must be united with all ministers.

Says Rev. Richard C. Sanders, Executive Director, "We don't condone wrong doing -- crime or any action demonstrative of action or behavior other than what ministers preach at large." Rev. Sanders further added that, "The Black Church has been the stabilizing

institution era, and many preachers feel that it is this very foundation, which is threatened when community loses its reverence for spiritual leaders -- in many instances unjustly." Our purpose as a coalition will be to make every effort to get both sides of the story before destroying the reputation of the Black Church and its Preachers.'

Rev. Charles Minns, Treasurer stated that he was excited and pleased to be part of this vital group that has come forward to support and uphold the image of the Testament Church. Says Rev. Minns, "We must understand the attack is aimed at the preachers, however, Satan's overall strategy is to destroy the

church." Rev. Woods' Secretary, stated that the time for preservation and unity of the church has come.

Rev. Bailey, Member, stated that he too was excited that Pastor Sanders and others have made a stand toward preserving the image of the church. Rev. Knight, Member, added that he was proud to be involved and also was very proud of the leaders and leadership set before him. And Rev. Montgomery, Member, expressed his willingness to assist as much and whereever he could.

Rev. Sanders, Executive Director, stated that he'd been in the city of Compton for three years and has never seen such attacks against preachers and church. He added that, "We must restore respect to the community. We don't want to coverup mistakes." He added, "With the spiritual awakening I have within me, and the spiritural support I have with me in this battle against sin, I know we can
