Governor Announces Nevada Receives \$3.7 Million In Federal Emergency Funds

CARSON CITY—Governor Richard Bryan announced today that Nevada will receive \$3.7 million in federal emergency funds for flood damage caused by the major storm we had in February.

The Governor declared five northern Nevada counties disaster areas and was successful in getting President Reagan to provide federal assistance. Heavy rains and snow caused washed out roads, bridges and caused other major damage to state highways.

Governor Bryan said,
"This money will reimburse
Nevadans for the damage
caused by the storm and
allow us to continue badly
needed highway
improvements in the state."

The emergency funds were approved late today by the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The \$3.7 million covers 100 percent of the costs on 18 projects.
