He talked to Seattle head coach Chuck Knox and one Seahawk assistant, Ralph Hawkins, who coaches defensive backs.

Hunter spoke quickly into the phone.

"Yes. Yes. Yes. You bet I'll play, any position you ask me to," he said. "Third round. What number? The 14th pick in the third round. This is it."

What did Knox say at the other end of the line?

"He said he was happy to get me and they had a spot open," Hunter said.

Hunter was excited. Before hanging up the phone, he asked the Seahawks to do something for him.

"Could you tell my mom I said hello? Make the pick and tell my mother I said hello," Hunter told the Seahawks.

In the confusion and excitement of draft day, Hunter probably thought Knox was announcing his

selection on television. Hunter wanted Knox to say hello on national TV to his mother, Hattie Webb, who was watching the draft on television at her home in Concord, Calif.

ESPN, the all-sports-cable channel, televised the draft from New York, where teams announced their picks. But Knox and his staff called Hunter from Seahawk headquarters in Seattle. Hunter's mother couldn't see Knox.

Patrick didn't know that. There was no cable TV in Room 424. Hunter couldn't see the draft.

He tried to call his mother. She tried to call him. The telephone operator failed to complete the first long-distance connection between Reno and Concord.

"It was my mom. She was screaming," Hunter said.

Finally, mother and son talked. It was the first calm moment for Patrick since the call from Seattle.
