

Bob Price files for seventh term

Assemblyman Bob Price has filed for his seventh term representing District 17.

Price, a democrat, was chairman of the Taxation, Transportation and Economic Development Committees. He served on Judiciary, Government Affairs, Commerce, Education, Agriculture, Natural Resources and Mining committees as well as special interim committees on Auto Insurance Rates and Practices, Alcohol and Drug Abuse, and Consumer Advocate's Office.

Price was appointed to the State Health Coordinating Committee by Governor O'Callaghan, Public Gaming Policy by Governor List, and Alcohol and Drug Abuse by Governor Bryan.

As a long-time critic of the insurance industry, Price hopes to see an end to the

laissez faire attitude of the legislature toward insurance companies. "The priority of Nevada citizens and small

business over the giant's appetite is long overdue," said Price.

Price, 50, is an electrician and real estate salesman. He and his wife Nancy are parents of six children.

Elizabeth Dole to speak at NEDCO minority confab

U.S. Transportation Secretary Elizabeth Dole will deliver the keynote address at Caesars Palace Thursday to a national conference on minority business sponsored here by the Nevada Economic Development Co. (NEDCO).

Dole, whose agency requires affirmative action minority hiring by road building contractors in states that receive federal funds, will address related issues.

Her talk will follow a noon luncheon in the hotel's Colosseum room for several hundred conference delegates.

Additional speakers include Jim Carr, a member of the U.S. Senate Budget

Committee staff; Michael Mescon, dean of business at Georgia State University; and JoAnn Collins, a special assistant to Secretary Dole.

The conference also features panel discussions, workshops and meetings between minority business entrepreneurs, federal officials and executives of major national corporations.

The conference will focus on how minorities and women who have entered the business realm can "take the next step" toward mainstream procurement, production, marketing opportunities and profits.

Participants are expected from many areas, including

Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico.

For the convenience of West Las Vegas residents, a voter registration office is now open at 1312 North "F" Street, Suite "B".

Field Deputy Registrars are available from 8:00 a.m. to Noon, and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday to re-register, voters or register anyone who has not registered in Clark County previously.

The Clark County Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, September 3, and the General Election on Tuesday November 4. Voter registration for the Primary Election closes at 9:00 p.m. on August 2, and registration for the General Election closes on October 4, at 9:00 p.m.

To qualify for registration one must have resided in Clark County for at least 30 days, and bring one of the following I.D.s: A current drivers license, a Health Department card, or a Sheriff's card. The registration process takes less than ten minutes.

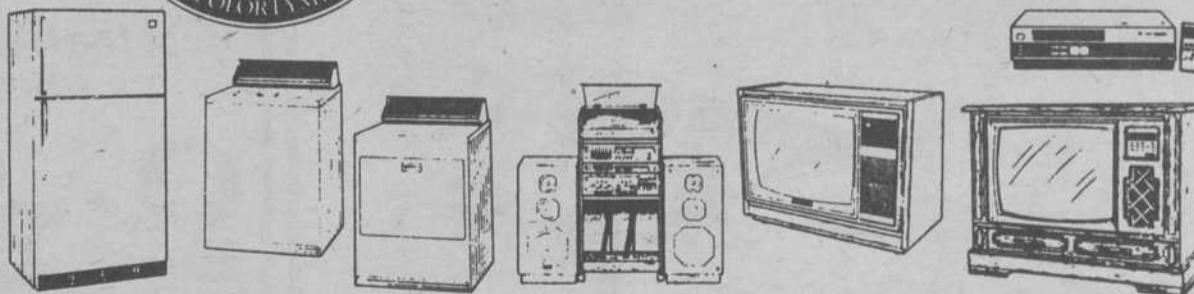
