## Slain GI's Mom **Eyed In Bias Attack**

DETROIT, Mich. - The racial storm created by Dearborn's enactment of a "Residents only parks law," did not prevent Mrs. Alice Beecham from accepting an invitation to participate in that white dominated community's Memorial Day parade. She is the mother of Army Sgt. Kenneth T. Ford who was slain in West Berlin during a terrorist bombing attack in April. The act generated the U.S. attack on Libya. The last Nov. law, banning non-residents from using most Dearborn parks. has been legally attacked by the American Civil Liberties Union and the Detroit NAACP. Both organizations are in accord that the ordinance is racially intended in its design. In her statement Mrs. Beecham said that "Though she too believes the park ban was racially conceived, she however accepted the parade invitation to participate solely to honor her son. Parade chair Colin McGee, who is also a Dearborn policeman, that the park
