Bishop Desmond Tutu says President Reagan is "out of step" with Americans on the issue of sanctions against South Africa because there is strong support in the United States for such measures.

Reagan ordered limited sanctions last September to try to thwart tougher Congressional measures. But Tutu cited legislation introduced in Congress this month that would toughen measures by barring new U.S. business investment and bank loans to private best companies in South Africa.
