Cruz to Replace Sosa on June 23 Boxing Card

Steve Cruz, ranked ninth by the World Boxing Association, has been named as replacement for Fernando Sosa, and will challenge WBA featherweight champion Barry McGuigan for the title, June 23rd at Ceasars Palace. Sosa was forced to withdraw from the title bout because of eye injuries.

Cruz, 25-1 with 13 KOs, is managed by Dave Gorman and trained by Joe Birrientes. Gorman is responsible for such top fighters as world welterweight champion Donald Curry, former junior middleweight champion Gene Hatcher and top lightweight contender Robin Blake.

Among Cruz' 25 victims are highly regarded Nicky Perez, Dana Roston and Victor Acosta.
