Marilyn McCoo Joins Neil Sedaka At Bally Grand •

Bally, Grand, formerly the MGM Grand Hotel, will mark a first on Thursday, July 24. Neil Sedaka will perform at the hotel for his first time. Appearing with Sedaka will be the beautiful and talented Marilyn McCoo.

Both will be holding forth at cocktail shows in the hotel's beautiful Celebrity Room

The name of Neil Sedaka is one that is certainly not unknown in Las Vegas. The man and his music have been a part of the Las Vegas scene for many years, and a large number of fans have virtually "grown up" on Sedaka's music.

As one of pop music's legendary pioneers, Sedaka has scores of hit songs and countless platinum and gold discs stretching back over 30 years. Among his impressive array of hits have been "Breaking Up Is Hard To Do," "Love Will Keep Us Together," "Laughter in the Rain," "Solitaire," "The Hungry Years" and the beautiful hit that he did together with his daughter Dara, "Should've Never Let You Go."

As a result of having lived in England during the seventies, Sedaka and his music are almost as well known and loved in Europe as they are in the U.S.

Neil is the author of more than 1,000 songs, and between the years 1959 and 1963, more than 25 million copies of his records were sold. He has been inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame and has played with a number of symphony orchestras, a classical side to his talent that he also offers a bit of to audiences at his shows.

Marilyn McCoo is not just another pretty face — although she is certainly that too. While Marilyn first achieved fame as one fourth of the award-winning musical group 'The 5th Dimension,' more recently, she has become even better known as the co-host of the musical program 'Solid Gold'

While she was with The 5th Dimension, she recorded "Up, Up and Away in My Beautiful Balloon," which became one of the most successful discs in the history of recorded music. In the late sixties and early seventies, The 5th



Dimension won six Grammy Awards. "It was one of the most wonderful experiences of my life," Marilyn says.

Although Marilyn and Billy are secure in their marriage, she has since gone on to establish herself as a solo artist. She has appeared at the hotel before when Bally's was still the MGM Grand.

While beauty is only skin deep, even if Marilyn were not beautiful and talented, she still has one final ace in the hole:
