Birth Certificates For Kindergarteners

July is the best time for parents of kindergarteners to pick up copies of birth certificates for school registration. According to Wanda Turpin, assistant deputy registrar of the Vital Records office, those who get copies now can avoid a wait in line next month.

Birth records for children born in Clark County are available at the Vital Records office of the Clark County Health District, 625 Shadow Lane, Las Vegas. The office is open 8 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Monday through Friday. Over-the-counter copies for school registration, sports activities, social security information, driver's licenses, job permits, security clearances and passports are available for \$6 each.

A wallet-size birth registration card is also available at the office. The card is a convenient record of birth information and can also serve as a child identification card or an emergency medical card. Birth registration cards are \$5 for a set of two. Cards can be laminated at the Vital Records office for \$1 per card.

Parents who want to purchase birth registration cards for child identification should bring a picture of the child to the Vital Records office. The picture will be attached to the card prior to lamination.

Copies of birth and death certificates are available at the Vital Records office, or may be ordered by mail. To order by mail, write: Vital Records Office, Clark County Health District, P.O. Box 4426, Las Vegas, NV 89127. Remember to enclose the certificate fee.

EOB Now Accepting Head Start Applications

For parents of children, who are 3 and 4-years-old, and income eligible, applications are now being accepted for the 1986-1987 Head Start school year.

Head Start is a pre-school program for children from low-income families, foster homes, children of parents in educational and employment training, and some eligible handicapped children.

These children must meet the eligible income guidelines, as set by the U.S. Department of Health

and Human Services, Administration for Children, Youth and Families, and the requirements of the local Head Start Program.

Head Start is operated by the Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County. There are at present six (6) center locations in Clark County (West Las Vegas, East Las Vegas, Northeast Las Vegas, and Henderson).

Final Day of registration for the September enrollment is Friday, August 22, 1986.

Flamingo Library Schedules Full and Partial Closings

As the Flamingo Library (1401 E. Flamingo Rd.) undergoes the final stages of construction, renovation and retrofitting, all or some library departments will be temporarily closed to patrons.

Despite its popularity, the Head Start program today only has enough funding to serve fewer than a fifth of the children who need it. The result is that poor children are now far less likely than other children to get his crucial early help. Statistics for 1982 show that a three-to four-year-old whose family makes \$25,000 and up was almost twice as likely to be enrolled in early childhood programs than a youngster from a low-income (under \$10,000) background. This unfairness loads yet another disadvantage onto the low-income child who is already starting life hampered by inadequate nutrition, poor health care, and other problems.

How can our nation help all children get off to a strong start? We do not need a new study or a new program. Our existing federal Head Start program can do the job, if we boost its resources.

This year, we have an opportunity to do just that. Congress, which is now debating the two-year reauthorization of the program, is also considering expanding our nation's commitment to Head Start. The House of Representatives has taken a significant first step by increasing the program's funding in its budget resolution.

If we tell our Congressmen and Senators that we support this increase, we have a good chance of winning a head start for more young children — this year.
