officer in 1968 and three blocks over (from headquarters) Blacks were not allowed to go to Harold's Club. Nevada was referred to as the Mississippi of the West." Later Mack said in his talk that "Its true that hard work and education makes one a success. But not always. You need the opportunity. And that's what this (week long program) is all about."

The Scholars program had 14 participants, 11 from Southern Nevada and 3 from Northern Nevada. The students stayed at the College Inn Residence Hall

for the first three nights and were assigned to faculty residence for the last three nights. This aspect of the program gives the students a chance to interact with faculty in a more personal way.

EFNEP Offers Teen Pre-Natal Program

While her friends are swimming at the neighborhood pool, 14-year-old Susan is at home-learning about good nutrition for pregnant teenagers.

EFNEP's TEEN PRE-NATAL PROGRAM helps low-income teen mothers like Susan have a healthy pregnancy and build a better baby. The pilot program, an off-shoot of Nevada Cooperative Extension's Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP), has helped more than 55 young women since it's inception just eight months ago. The series of inhome nutrition lessons places these girls in an atmosphere of encouragement and self-help.

Adolescent pregnancy is routinely considered high risk. Congenital defect, obstetric complication and prematurity are typical problems. In addition, disproportionately large numbers of low birth weight babies -- infants weighing less than 5.5 pounds -- are born to adolescent mothers. Among low-income teens, these risks greatly increase as these youth typically have the lowest level of nutrition information available to them.
