


Delta Scholar Program Seeks Area Students

Valley Student Center sets delay in construction

As a result of unexpected delays in the removal of asbestos from the student center portion of Valley High School, a contingency plan has been developed. District officials had hoped contractors would complete work on this phase of the Valley project by mid-August to make way for band rehearsals, student athletic practices and provide access to lockers and showers.

Because of contractor delays it is now estimated the student center won't be ready for use until at least October 1.

Affected student activities including band, volleyball and football have been rearranged. Instead of using Valley for practice, teams will use K.O. Knudsen Junior High School, Southern Nevada Vocational-Technical Center and Cannon Junior High School.

All six football teams (Valley and Chaparral) will practice at Chaparral. Additional storage trailers have been brought onto Chaparral's campus to use for storage of Valley team uniforms

Instead of bringing student athletes to Valley for practice, buses will transport athletes to Chaparral.

Since Valley won't be able to use their own stadium to play two scheduled home games during September, they will be the visiting team at Eldorado and Rancho. On September 5th Valley will play at Eldorado. Valley will be hosted by Rancho on Sept. 19.

All physical education classes for Valley and Chapparal students will be held at Chaparral.

Asbestos removal and fire safety retrofit work began this summer at Valley High School and Orr Junior High School as part of a five-year, \$37 million dollar program districtwide. Valley and Orr will be closed for the entire 1986-87 school year while classes are conducted on a double session schedule pairing Valley with Chapparal High School and Orr with Woodbury Junior High School.

Despite the current delays, the overall asbestos/retrofit program remains on schedule.
