This means the card, dubbed "Clash of the Continents" by Dynamic Duo, Inc., promoters of the world championship doubleheader in association with the Las Vegas Hilton, features Europe's finest fighters against two top Americans.

The undefeated Kacar,

Spinks, from Philadelphia, of course, is the unbeaten IBF heavyweight champion while Tangstad, from Tonsbery, Norway, is the European title-holder.

Both world championship bouts are scheduled for 15 rounds and will be held in the Hilton Center, the 9,000-seat indoor arena at the Las Vegas Hilton.

The championship card starts at 5 p.m. (PDT) with doors to the Hilton Center opening at 4. The Spinks-Tangstad main event begins

Federation light heavyweight Czyz, from Wanaque, N.J., Slobodan Kacar is getting his long-awaited shot

the 175-pound crown he won last year while the top-rated world

world is making his first defense of at approximately 7:30 with the Kacar-Czyz semi main preceding it.

Tickets. with prices starting at \$50, are on sale at the Hilton Special Events Ticket Office located in the lobby area of the Las Vegas Hilton from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The Hilton Special Events Ticket Office telephone number is (702) 732-5320.

The card will be televised live nationally by Home Box Office (HBO) but will be blacked out in the Las Vegas

The 28-year-old Kacar has a record of 20-0 with 11 knockouts while Czyz, 24, has a mark of 28-1 with 19 knockouts.

This will be the first defense for Kacar since winning the IBF light heavyweight championship on Dec. 21, 1985, in Pessaro, Yugoslavia, when he took a 15-round decision over former World Boxing Association 175-pound king Eddie Mustafa Muhammad.

Kacar had an outstanding amateur career, culminating with a gold medal at the 1980 Moscow Olympics. Now he only the second Yugoslavian to hold a

professional world title, following Mate Parlov, who was the World Boxing Council light heavyweight champion in 1978.

Czyz is attempting to become the first New Jersey native to win a world light heavyweight championship since Gus Lesnevich did in 45 years ago in 1941.

Czyz was an outstanding middleweight before moving up to the light heavyweight ranks. He has win over former world champions Elisha Obed, Oscar Alvarado and Murray Sutherland plus highly touted Robbie Sims.

Spinks, the only man to win the heavyweight world championship after holding the light heavyweight title, has a record of 29-0 with 19 knockouts.

Tangstad, trying to become the first European to hold the world heavyweight championship since Ingemar Johannson in 1959 and 1960, has a record of 24-1-2 with 14 knockouts.

Tangstad, at 27, three years younger and at 220, 15 pounds heavier than Spinks, the European championship in his most recent outing in April when he beat John Westgard.
