

## Heritage Festival Time Is Here!

This year the festival is being brought back into the Westside community and the kick-off event is the "D" Street Festival Revival, which is a tribute to the originator, Monk Montgomery. "D" Street will trace Black music from the Negro Spiritual to gospel, to blues, to jazz. It features the talent of local jazz and strip entertainers and the musical conducting of bassist, Rudy Aikels. Dr. Paul Meacham will also be featured and Paul Dawkins, Community Affairs Director for KLAS-TV, will be the emcee for the evening.

There will be community awards and two scholarships given to youths who have submitted essays entitled "What My Heritage Means To Me" and who possess a 3.0 grade point average. One scholarship is donated solely by Ray & Ross Transport and the second will be from the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity.

"D" Street Festival Revival will be held at the Heritage Hall at 7:30pm on Monday, August 25. The donations is \$15.00 and all proceeds go toward the Phi Beta Sigma Scholarship Fund.

### Facts on Black Farmers Released

Washington, DC--The average Black farmer owns about 100 acres of land compared to a national average of nearly 500 acres for the typical white farmer. That was just one of the facts contained in reports on the status of the nation's Black farmers. The reports were made public by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Civil Rights Commission. It was also revealed that over 90 percent of Black-operated farms are located in just 16 southern states.

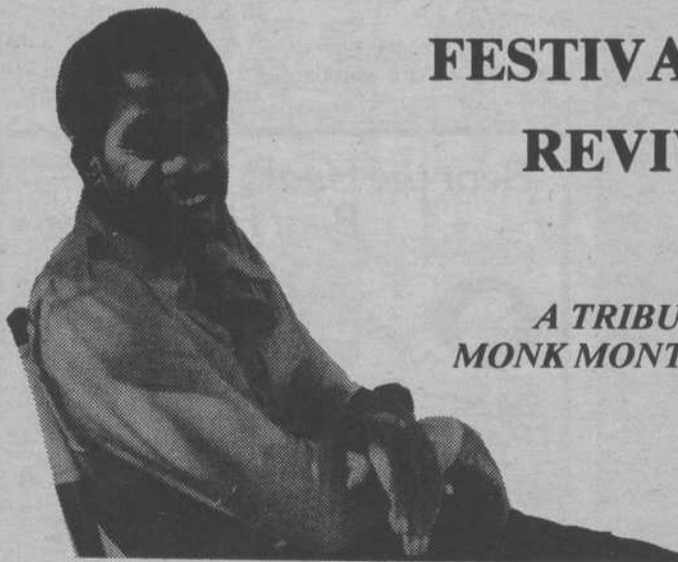
