Julian Bond and John Lewis Face Georgia Run-Off

Atlanta, Ga.--State Senator Julian Bond captured better than 47 percent of the vote and emerged as the biggest vote-getter in the race for the 5th district congressional seat. However, by failing to capture a majority of the vote he now faces a run-off election against former civil rights comrade John Lewis. Lewis received 35 percent of the votes. Five other candidates for the congressional seat split the remaining votes. The race for the U.S. Congress had become a bitter contest between Bond and Lewis with the two civil rights veterans frequently hurling charges at one another. Observers expect Bond to win the run-off election on September 2.

More Nude Vanessa Williams' Photos Expected

White Plains, N.Y.--The photographer who ended the reign of Vanessa Williams as the nation's first Black Miss America by releasing nude pictures of the beauty queen, says he will soon release some more. Tom Chiapel refused to say when the pictures would be released but he told an interviewer that he has been planning a portfolio for 18 months. Chiapel is rumored to have gotten \$50,000 from Penthouse magazine for the first set of nude pictures of Williams. The release of those pictures -- taken while Williams worked as a receptionist for Chiapel in 1982 -- forced her to relinquish the Miss America crown in 1984.

Black Democrats Appear Ready to Oppose Lucas in Michigan

Detroit, Mi.--Black Michigan democratic leaders appear ready to oppose the gubernatorial aspirations of Black republican William Lucas. Lucas recently won the GOP nomination for governor. In close race against democratic governor James Blanchard, Michigan's Black vote who make up 11 percent of the electorate could provide the margin of victory. However, whether Blacks will vote for Lucas remains an open question.



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
