Dr. Paul Goodwin, the director of junior high schools during past years, received a promotion to the Associate Superintendent for the Division of Student Services. This is an important division for the School District, a division that handles programs involving alternative schools and special education which only illustrates two of the tasks assumed by Dr. Goodwin. Congratulations Paul, and good luck in the new position.

To fill the vacancy at the junior high school level the district appointed Lou

Silvestri. Lou was the principal of Cannon Jr. High School and, through his leadership, established Cannon as one of the outstanding junior high schools in the state. This school originated one of the first programs in computer awareness for junior high Unique school students. management programs for other instructional areas were designed by Silvestri and his staff, and more importantly, Silvestri provided the type of adminstrative leadership that fostered high morale, both with the faculty and the students. Valley High School Procedures Clarified

Despite efforts to inform Valley High School parents and students about double session schedules and procedures there still seems to be some confusion.

Only the Valley High School building will be closed during the 1986-87 school year--the name remains the same. Valley's building is being overhauled as part of a districtwide asbestos abatement/fire safety retrofit program. During the entire school year, Valley will share Chaparral High School's facility on a double session schedule. Neither school will occupy the building at the same time.

It is important to note that Valley High School will retain its name and identity while sharing the Chaparral campus during 1986-87.

Chaparral will use the building for its school program from 6:40 a.m. to 11:40 a.m. and Valley will hold classes in the same facility from 12:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Separate administration quarters have been established to serve Valley parents and students. The headquarters for Valley High School are located within Chaparral High School on the second floor of the east side of the main building.

Although Valley's administration is housed within the Chaparral building, they maintain a separate address which is 3970 East Viking Road, Las Vegas, NV 89121.
