White House, Education Department Conference to Spur Minority Participation in Science and Technology

The U.S. Department of Education will join the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy in sponsoring a conference to promote science and technology programs at historically black colleges and universities through partnerships with industry and government.

Secretary of Education William J. Bennett said the purpose of the conference is to find ways to strengthen science and technology curricula at historically black institutions. "We will examine successful science and technology partnerships already in place at many of our colleges and universities. What we learn can be used to increase opportunities in the fields of science and engineering for blacks. Historically black colleges and universities can and must play a large role. The talent potential is there."

The conference, to be convened September 18 and 19, is being financed by corporations and foundations. The two-day session will be held at the National Academy of Sciences, 2101 Constitution Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The conference is scheduled to coincide with National Historically Black Colleges Week, September

15-20, and the fifth anniversary of President Reagan's Executive Order 12320. This Executive Order was signed on September 15, 1981 directing federal agencies to help historically black colleges successfully compete for federal grants and contracts, and stimulate private sector initiatives.

The major address of the conference will be given by Dr. Robert Anderson, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer, Rockwell International.

Other key speakers will include Dr. David Saxon, Chairman of the Corporation, Massachusetts Institute of Technology; Dr. Lewis Branscomb, Vice President and Chief Scientist, International Business Machines; Dr. Sol Buchsbaum, Executive Vice President for Customer Systems, American Telephone and Telegraph; and Dr. Fred Garry, Vice President for Corporate Engineering and Manufacturing, General Electric Corporation.
