

Get Out To Vote Precinct Headquarters Being Readied In West Las Vegas For The 1986 General Election

Carolyn Funchess and H.P. Fitzgerald are in the process of organizing a Get Out To Vote headquarters for voters in Assembly District six and seven for the 1986 General Election. The organization will be headquartered at 1312 North "F" Street, Suite "B", and the telephone numbers are 647-0086 and 647-0088.

Tentative plans call for recruiting volunteer workers from all twenty precincts in

the two districts. At least thirty workers are needed to perform such tasks as poll watchers, telephone bank operators, automobile drivers, food distributors, team supervisors and shift supervisors. The operation will function from 7-a.m. to 7-p.m. on election day, November 4, 1986. Food and beverages will be provided.

NLV Awarded Dept. Commerce Grant

Mayor James K. Seastrand announced today that the City of North Las Vegas has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration, in the amount of \$643,200. By providing matching funds of \$428,800, the city will build a \$1,072,000 flood channel in the northeast area of the city, north of Craig Road.

"This project has been a real community effort," explained Mayor Seastrand, "with grass roots support from the Nevada Black Chamber of Commerce and

from the Chamber's Overall Economic Development Plan (OEDP) Committee."

"We completed the first economic development plan for this area in 1985," stated Nevada Black Chamber Executive Director Gwen Brown-Coleman, "and we recently completed the first annual update. The City of North Las Vegas' highest priority was this flood channel project, and Dr. James McMillan, Chairman of the OEDP Committee, wrote a strong letter for it. We're very excited that the City of North Las Vegas has been successful in developing a project under the Chamber's Overall Economic Development Plan that will significantly improved their economic development potential."

Identified in the North Las Vegas Master Flood Plan as the upper branch of the Western Tributary of the Las Vegas Wash, the flood channel improvements will help to protect over 470 acres of land, with approximately half of the property zoned for industrial use and half for residential use.
