## **Badgers Plan to Give Rebels**

The largest crowd in Silver Bowl history is expected for Saturday's UNLV-Wisconsin game and Rebel coach Wayne Nunnely says he could care less that about two-thirds of the fans will be Badgers rooters.

"It'll be good to see all those seats filled," Nunnely said of the anticipated SRO crowd of 32,000.

'There's sure going to be a lot of red in the stands. I'd rather they be UNLV fans than Wisconsin ones, but it's going to look like they're from UNLV if nothing else."


