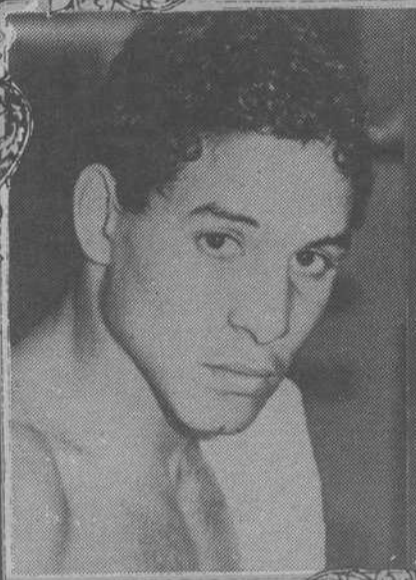

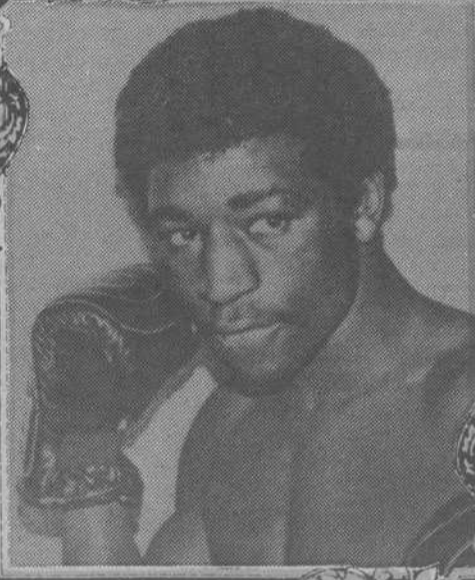

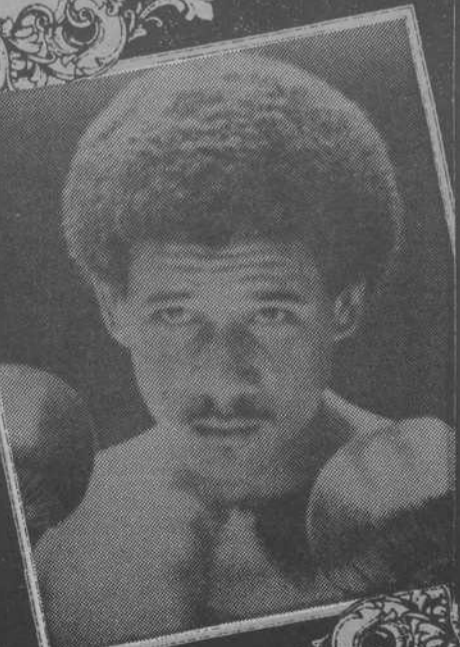

The Caesars Palace Olympiad Race and Sports Book will be the only Las Vegas closed circuit broadcast outlet for three world championship fights, two on Friday, September 26, and one on Saturday, September 27.

Free and open to the public, the Caesars sports center will host the live television broadcast of Friday's double header which features World Boxing Council lightweight champion Hector "Macho" Camacho (30-0 with 16 KOs) in a scheduled 12-round title defense against hard-punching Cornelius Boza-Edwards (44-5-1, 34 KOs). As co-main event on the Friday card, World Boxing Association lightweight champion Livingstone Bramble (24-1-1), 15 KOs) will risk his crown in a scheduled 15-round match with Puerto Rico's Edwin Rosario (23-2, 19 KOs). Televised action begins at 6 p.m. PDT.

On Saturday, September 27, undisputed world welterweight Champion Donald "Cobra" Curry (25-0, 20 KOs) takes on number one contender Lloyd Honeyghan (27-0, 17 KOs) for the 147-pound crown. The broadcast begins at 7 p.m. PDT, live from Caesars Atlantic City.

The championship battles will be shown on 11 x 15-foot screens, and on monitors in the Caesars Palace Sports Book and Olympic Lounge (north casion). No advance tickets or reservations are necessary.
