The Circus Maximus Showroom at Caesars Palace will throb with the infectious rhythms and sassy lyrics of The Pointer Sisters Oct. 1-6.

Ruth, Anita and June are ladies at the top with their 1983 album "Break Out" still selling past the triple platinum mark (more than three million copies sold). Among its four Top 10 singles, "Jump," "I'm So Excited" and "Neutron Dance" are showstoppers. Now that their 1985 album "Contact" is certified gold (500,000 copies sold), the sisters plan to release a new LP, "Hot Together," in October.

Henny Youngman, who hosted the St. Louis contest, took on Louie as a personal writer. Since then, Anderson has worked as an opening artist for entertainers like Rodney Dangerfield, Glen Campbell and Ray Charles. His feature film appearances include "Cloak & Dagger," "Quicksilver" and "Ratboy."
